Reportable Conduct Scheme Workplace Investigations Seminar

The Commission for Children and Young People is pleased to work in collaboration with the Office of the New South Wales (NSW) Ombudsman to offer a series of one day workplace investigations seminars to Victorian religious and faith-based organisations.

The NSW Ombudsman has over 18 years of experience in oversighting the NSW reportable conduct scheme, and delivering workshops to those responsible for undertaking and reviewing investigations of reportable conduct allegations involving employees and volunteers.

Who should attend?

These seminars are designed for heads of organisations, managers who oversee investigations and investigators.

What will be covered?

- an overview of the requirements of the Victorian Reportable Conduct Scheme
- steps in the investigation process
- risk assessment and risk management strategies
- investigation techniques and strategies for investigating particular types of conduct including grooming, neglect, emotional / psychological harm
- investigating conduct outside of work
- · reaching and responding to findings based on available evidence
- documentation and recording keeping practices
- reaching and responding to findings based on available evidence.


